Make sure you know the difference between stem-and-leaf plots and box-and-whisker plots.

Describing Data Cht. 2# 2.15, 2.17, 2.19, 2.21, 2.23

Normal Distributions Cht. 3# 3.15, 3.17, 3.19, 3.21, 3.23

Make sure you can find z-values and percentiles and understand that the z-value is not the same thing as the percentile!

Scatterplots and Correlation Cht. 4# 4.15, 4.17, 4.19, 4.21

Regression Cht. 5 # 5.19, 5.23, 5.25

You should be able to explain the meaning of r^2 .

Two-Way Tables Cht.6 # 6.9, 6.17

The book uses the term conditional distributions for both row and column distributions. It also uses the term marginal distribution for the distributions of the totals row and column.

Sampling Cht. 8# 8.17, 8.23, 8.43

Make sure you know the difference between random error and bias. What is the best way to avoid bias? What is the best way to minimize random error?

Experiments Cht. 9# 9.19, 9.21, 9.23, 9.25, 9.27

Know the difference between explanatory variables, response variables, and lurking variables.
